





Placement Guidelines for the 2024-2025 School Year

In addition to standardized test scores, OLCHS will include additional criteria for placement into freshman-level classes. This is an opportunity for students to enrich their learning experience and be placed into the most appropriate course in each subject area. Students are encouraged to take the most challenging coursework that they are prepared for and will receive appropriate support regardless of placement.

The Class of 2028 Placement Process includes student and family input in the selection of classes. In order to do so, we will consider the following information when determining placement:

- Middle School Teacher Recommendation
- 2. Standardized Test Scores and/or Writing Samples
- 3. Eighth Grade Grades in Progress (or Standards Met)
- 4. Student Elective Interest
- 5. Student/Family Enrollment Requests

All course placements were determined collaboratively with OLHMS and Simmons. Spanish and Arabic placements are in progress.

 - OLCHS will begin the residency verification process in early 2024 by attempting to electronically verify each family's residence
 - School fees are due at the time of final registration in late July/early August.
 - Students can access their schedule in Skyward when final registration is completed.
